# Who am I?

# What is Jenkins?

- Jenkins is the leading open source continuous integration server.
- It is primarily written in Java, but is also used for projects in Ruby, Python, Objective-C, and much, much more.
- It is essential to the development workflow at such companies as GitHub, Netflix, LinkedIn, and many, many more.

# Brief Jenkins History

- Kohsuke Kawaguchi created the project in 2006 while at Sun.
- Kohsuke now works at CloudBees.
- The Jenkins project split from Oracle in January, 2011.
- You probably know some of that story. =)

# Legal Umbrella

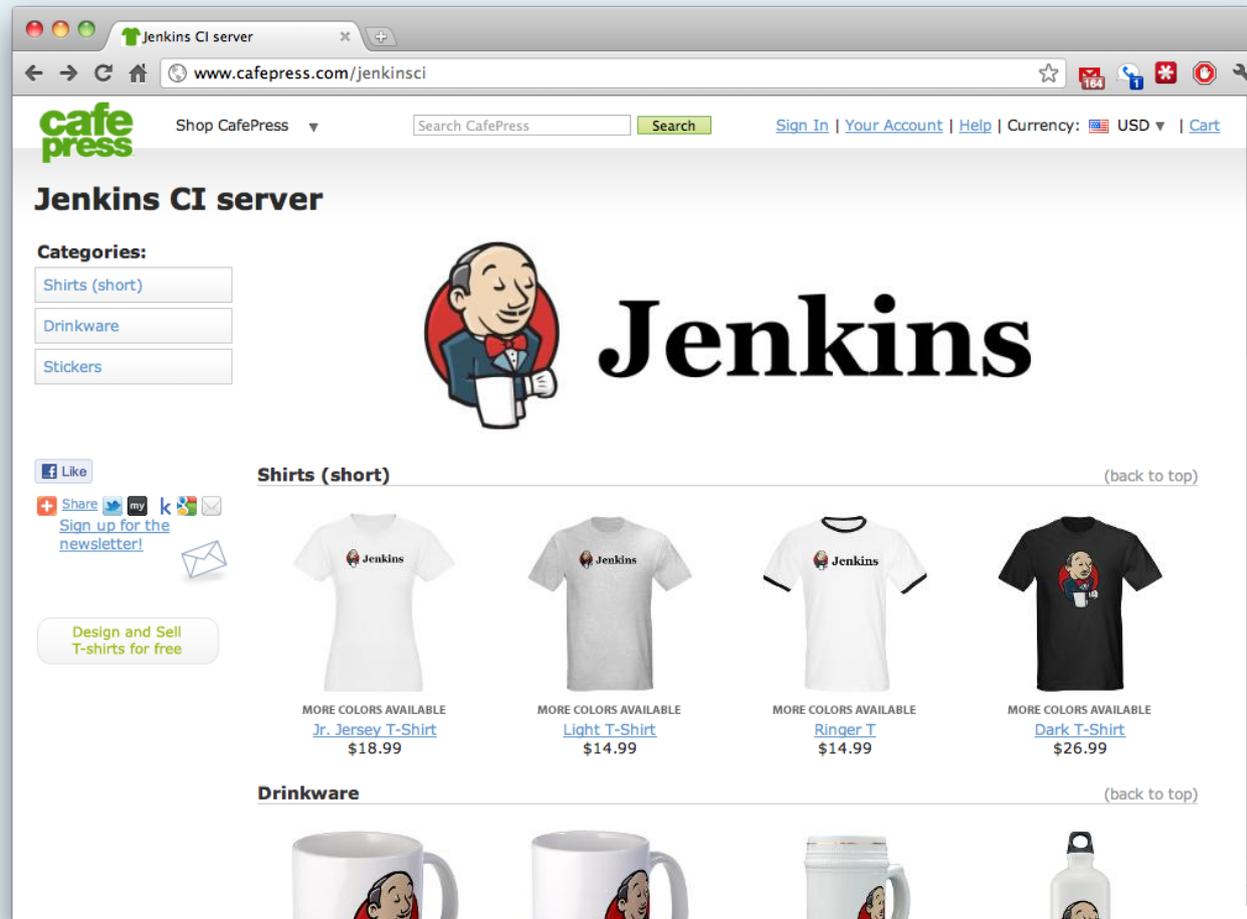
- We are now members of SPI (Software in the Public Interest, <http://spi-inc.org>)

# Some Statistics

- Jenkins is downloaded over 13,000 times a week.
- 1700+ subscribers to Jenkins user list.
- 1000+ subscribers to Jenkins developer list.
- 4000+ followers of @jenkinsci on Twitter.

# Some More Statistics

- In May alone, our anonymous usage statistics tool reported over 13,000 installations using Jenkins 1.396 or newer – that is, releases since the split with Oracle.

# Yet More Statistics

- Over 200 forks of Jenkins core on GitHub!
- 532 repositories (as of today!) in jenkinsci org on GitHub.
- 100+ public members of org, and 250+ total members.
- 175+ pull requests made for Jenkins core!

# Oh, and...

375+ plugins publicly available!

# LTS Releases - why?

- Jenkins' weekly release schedule has been a strength
  - Rapid bug fixes
  - Less wait for new features
- But not everyone wants to be on the bleeding edge.

# LTS Releases

- Hence, LTS Releases!
- Every ~3 months, a new LTS branch, based on an older, tested normal release.
- LTS release candidates thoroughly tested before release.
- Backports will be made of critical bugs.

# Groovy for Frontend Work

- Groovy has long been usable for plugin and core code.
- But as of 1.417, you can replace Jelly with Groovy!
